Working in small groups and in plenary sessions, participants will use a mix of exemplar and real scenarios commonly encountered in real world implementation settings to familiarise themselves with concepts in implementation and planning processes, factors, strategies and evaluation. The day will explore the opportunities and challenges commonly encountered by all real world implementers, implementation supporters and implementation researchers, using *The Implementation Game* to problem-solve and build quality and sustainability. Throughout the day participants will learn to apply the best learning and evidence-informed principles from global implementation studies across many fields.

Suitable for newcomers to implementation science and practice as well as more experienced practitioners, educators, service managers and leaders, researchers and implementation support professionals, the day will provide a unique opportunity for interactive learning and discussion in an informal environment with two international contributors to the implementation field.

**Melanie Barwick, PhD, CPsych** is a Senior Scientist in the Child Evaluative Sciences Program of the SickKids' Research Institute. She is affiliated with the SickKids' Learning Institute where she sits on the AboutKidsHealth Editorial Board, provides leadership on the Education Council, and leads professional and resource development in knowledge translation within the KT Program. She is also affiliated with the SickKids Centre for Global Child Health as a scientist and member of the leadership.

At the University of Toronto, she is Full Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Adjunct Professor in the Dalla Lana School of Public Health.

She is a Governing Board Director for *AMREF Health Africa*, and Associate Editor for the journal, *Evidence & Policy*. She consults on KT-related matters in child and youth mental health, health and education sectors, and extends her impact via a varied social media presence. She is an internationally recognized expert in implementation science and knowledge translation and has a program of health services research that spans health, mental health, education, and global health sectors. Her research aims to improve the implementation of evidence into practice and to broaden the reach of evidence more generally to support decision making, policy, knowledge and awareness. She has extensive practical field experience in implementation, as lead technical assistance supporting outcome measurement for Ontario child and youth mental health provider organizations (2000-2015).

Melanie developed and provides professional development in knowledge translation internationally through the *Specialist Knowledge Translation Training™* (for researchers) and the *Knowledge Translation Professional Certificate™* (for KT practitioners) (<http://tinyurl.com/p2p5du6>). The KTPC is recognized as a Leading Practice by *Accreditation Canada* and has over 365 graduates worldwide. Since 2004, SKTT™ and SKTTAustralia™ have trained over 3000 learners internationally.
