
A practical workshop for practitioners, managers and researchers - focused on teaching the basics of practice change and providing tools for learning and planning

2nd UK Implementation Science Research Conference

This year's conference will explore the theme: 'Advancing the science of scaling up: Improving efficiency and effectiveness of implementation strategies in healthcare'.

The aim of this conference is to showcase the latest research in the field of implementation science applied to health care. It is an opportunity for applied-health researchers and policy makers to come together and share how best to implement evidence-based practice and clinical research within health services and systems.
